Your Priest-in-Charge Writes

Dear friends,

Wimbledon is drawing near; the season of strawberries and cream; the special sound of tennis balls hitting highly-strung rackets at great speeds; the extraordinary grunting sound of women tennis players as they put effort into their serves and volleys! Then there is the Twenty20 cricket with all the top teams and some others involved in the excitement of run-getting, wickets falling and nail-biting finishes. How times have changed in the way these sports are played, watched and funded. Rather like churchgoing actually! Time was when we didn't need to think about how we might sustain the rural church either financially, or in its being staffed by stipendiary clergy or volunteers to do things. Costs have increased even as full-time paid clergy numbers have decreased. This at a time when our society has continued to marginalise Christian faith and other faiths and try to live as if there were no other reference points than human values, beliefs and choices. By contrast leisure activities including sport have increased in their appeal and financial rewards to the very best whether in football, rugby, tennis, and now cricket.

Of course, some measure of relaxation is necessary to our wellbeing as human beings. Regular breaks from the pressure of work help us to recharge tired batteries, explore other worlds than our own by holidays abroad and reconnect with family and friends. The Sabbath day along with various Holy-days marked out the annual and weekly pattern of living in relation to each other in society, to work and the created order. What tied all these various activities together was the sense of a bigger order of things within which each was meant to have its place and value. What I think has happened of late is that with the decline of belief in this Big Story of the Bible other smaller stories and activities have come in to fill this space as having the highest value for our living, which has shaped itself around ever smaller spans of time. I heard one older woman supporter of a major football team in the Premier League say, "I have lived for My whole life at games and outside the matches has been lived around my team." What a sad case this is! Needless to say it was being reported as "normal", as "a good thing", something to be copied.

A very long time ago a wise man said: "You, O God, have made us for yourself; and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in You." When the glue in the chair joints melts away then all who would try to put their weight on it are in danger of coming crashing to the ground with a nasty bump. We live in a world in which *knowledge* is growing at a rapid rate but *wisdom* for living is increasingly hard to find.

"God has made everything suitable for its time; moreover he has put a sense of past and future into their minds... I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live; moreover, it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil.... The quiet words of the wise are more to be heeded than the shouting of a ruler among fools." (Ecclesiastes 3: 11—13; 9: 17)

May you be enriched in all that you do this summer, whether in work or in play. Remember the gift of your Creator and seek to serve and worship Him in all that you do. So, in this way of living I pray that you will discover peace and tranquillity even in the great busyness of your lives.

There are two vacancies on the Parish Council following the retirement of Maurice Carruthers and Peter Wybergh's decision not to stand for re-election. Several people have expressed an interest in joining the Parish Council. The Chairman will be contacting them in the near future.

It was noted that, although the road up to Warnell has been repaired the bump in the road outside the entrance to the reservoir is still there. We have contacted the Highways Steward about it.

We continue to receive complaints about the numbers of vehicles parked on the grass verges in Churchtown. The Clerk has contacted the Police and the Highways people about this again.

The Speed Indication devices will be returning to the Parish shortly. We will have the devices for a month and we have asked the Police to step up their speed monitoring in the area during this time.

We understand that the owners of Parkhead Quarry are proposing a new entrance to the quarry site in order to facilitate the reinstatement work that they are required to do under the enforcement order.

The Parish Council are firmly against the planned wind turbines at Reathwaite Farm and Chalkside Farm. We have expressed our objections to Allerdale planning section and to the Planning Inspectorate.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on 25 May at 7.30 in Welton Village Hall. The Parish Plan will be formally launched here. We will also have a presentation from the Broadband Group together with another speaker. Refreshments will be provided. This will also be the Parish's chance to thank Maurice Carruthers and Peter Wybergh for their years of service on the PC.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on 20 July 2011, 7.30 in Welton Village Hall..

- Eight or nine pages for designated areas, eg. Parish Council, News, Organisations and Services, Links

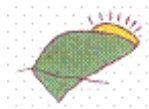

Rainfall.

April 2011. 55.60 mm (2.03 ins)

Aggregate 371.11 mm (14.81 ins)

April 2010. 30.90 mm (1.21 ins)

Aggregate 175.87 mm (6.77 ins)

Notes.

Although it did not rain for 21 days in the month it was wetter than March and most of the rain fell on two days, Saturday 2nd & Tuesday 5th, totalling 32.50 mm (1.28 ins) Also April last year was drier than this year. However the total rain for the first four months this year was double that of last year.



Temperatures.

Average maximum day temperature 16.13°C (61.03°F)

Average minimum night temperature 5.80°C (42.44°F)

Warmest day Thursday 21 April 23.20°C (73.76°F)

Coollest night Wednesday 27 April -0.60°C (30.92°F)

Notes.

We recorded frost on only one night, Wednesday 27 April, as against ten nights in March. The average monthly day temperature has been 11°F warmer and the night temperature 7°F warmer than March. It has been the warmest April since records began here, however the average monthly night temperature was the same as April 2009.

Wind.

The average wind speed for April was 3.0 mph, and on Saturday 2 April we recorded a high of 27 mph at 06.00 hrs.

The dominant wind direction for the month was from the South West.
