Dear friends,

Recent advances in computer-aided graphics have enabled so much more visually stunning effects to be achieved in films. Even to the point where in TOY STORY the whole film was achieved as a computer-aided graphic design. Much of this is to be celebrated as part of our God-given gifts of creativity and imagination that can so enrich our cultural life and shared memories. Stories used to be told through the medium of the voice only. Bards used to sing and say their stories to pass on the deeds of famous heroes of old and so the values and beliefs they lived by were given human shape and not merely passed on as abstract ideas. Before the Gospels of the New Testament were committed to writing they lived by word of mouth passed on by authentic teachers in communities of believers far and wide. Books and printing have given stories more permanent and durable forms as well as enabling access to their stored treasures to many more who could read. In this year we celebrate the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Authorised Version of the Bible. It affected and enriched the cultural, spiritual and even legal life of our nation so much, as books by Melvyn Bragg and Alister McGrath remind us. Modern digital and laser means of storing and transmitting information have widened the visual and emotional appeal achieved by the earlier age of celluloid films.

Despite all these advances though, the best films like "The Lord of the Rings" make a balanced use of computer-aided special effects, realism in costumes, armour and location along with the human drama enacted by actors who are given equal prominence. And at the heart of a film like "The Lord of the Rings" is a battle between good and evil forces; courage and friendship, self-sacrifice, folly and fury, and the love of simple things is valued above power for its own sake. Such themes by Tolkien and the *Narnia Chronicles* by C.S. Lewis remind us of the Bible's narrative in which God as Father and source of all has sent his only Son to live among us and to die on a cross to set us free from the ring of power that encircles our globe. His Holy Spirit has been sent to lift us up on eagles' wings above the sorrows and wastes of our fallen world doomed to die along with all kingdoms opposed to God's kingly rule through Christ. Today the Holy Spirit can take up and use all that is good and true in these films and stories of sacrifice and salvation. Let our lives reflect these things as we endeavour to follow our Lord through difficult and confusing times. He is a faithful friend who will stick close to us at all times.

## CASTLE SOWERBY PARISH COUNCIL AGM MAY 2011

Mr John Foster chaired the AGM of Castle Sowerby Parish Council and welcomed Parish Councillors, and five members of the public. He thanked the Councillors who had served during the past year and had been re-elected, and welcomed new Councillor, Phillipa Groves. Thanks were given to Howard Eastwood, Parish Clerk, and to internal auditor, Tracey Wetherell.

The Council had earned £592 during the year from proceeds of the recycling facility at Inglewood Edge.

The Highways Authority and our Community Police Officer had been notified of problems associated with local roads, flooding, white lining, signs, speeding traffic and potholes.

The Cumbria Rural Housing Trust carried out a survey.

A new Code of Practice had produced a more open and accountable Parish Council. The Council had introduced procedural improvements including Standing Orders, Financial Regulations, a Risk Management System and a new Internal Audit Policy. The Parish Council now has its own Web Site – [www.castlesowerby.org.uk](http://www.castlesowerby.org.uk)

**Grants.** £250 to Castle Sowerby Church Council towards grass cutting, and £200 to the Northern Fells Group.

**Public Consultation.** Kath Eastwood explained the setting up of the Northern Fells High Speed Broadband. A letter/leaflet explaining the procedure to be distributed in the parish to encourage people to register their support.

**Business meeting.** The Chairman and Vice Chairman were re-elected to serve for the current year.

**Insurance.** The Parish Insurance is due. The clerk had obtained a quote for £225, a saving of £80 over the previous insurers. Land used for sporting events i.e., clay pigeon shooting, would not be covered.

**Planning.** A planning application by Mr and Mrs D Kerry, to replace an existing outbuilding into additional accommodation. The Council agreed to support.

Cumbria County Council had agreed to supply road plannings to the passing places on the Coal Road. The Highways Authority to be contacted regarding potholes at Waterloo, Lyne Dene, Sowerby Roe, and the undermining of the highway at the Blue Bell, Sowerby Row.

## CALDBECK MOTHERS' UNION

At our May meeting we were welcomed by Ann Wade who led us in a short service during which we remembered in prayer those who, through ill health, were unable to be with us.

Ann then welcomed Hannah Scrase-Field who had come to speak to us in her capacity as a senior officer of NISCO (Northern Inter-Schools Christian Union). The importance of this organisation cannot be overestimated, given that recent statistics reveal that 95% of today's children have no regular contact with any church, and school has become almost the only way of introducing them to Christianity and Jesus.

It has not been easy to do this since RE is no longer a compulsory subject and many schools have no qualified teacher to engage with NISCO and able to make arrangements for visits. When invited an officer aims to establish lunch clubs and after school clubs. Hannah was particularly pleased to be able to do this in the brand new building of the Richard Rose Academy. This school had had a very shaky start but was now able to sustain a lunch club with 20 regular pupils and where she also had the opportunity to take several assemblies. NISCO uses every means available to reach schools and this year produced a most successful Road Show using music and drama which played to 3000 children across Carlisle. They are now training to use puppets as these have proved very effective in West Cumbria.

To assist in all this, Revd Kim Hurst, Superintendent Minister of the Wigton Circuit of the Methodist Church, has been appointed to make contact with several schools to introduce sessions of Christian teaching. Her expertise and enthusiasm have been much appreciated.

All of this depends on a supply of volunteers who are available to lend a hand when necessary at their local school. These have been recruited largely from church congregations in Carlisle – men and women of all ages who were made aware of the needs of children and responded to the appeals and prayers to join in what Hannah has described as the “Ministry to the unreached”!

We expressed our thanks to Hannah for giving us her time and sharing with us her experiences under the auspices of NISCO.

During questions, the issue of the axing of the Carlisle and Penrith buses was raised and the Chairman said that this is being followed up by the Parish Council with Rob Terwey, Transport Manager of Cumbria County Council. See below.

Local gritting of priority 3 minor roads. Following information received from Tony Pennell of Nenthead and Michael Bohling of Mungrisdale, it was agreed that Alan Tyson, William Cowx, Colin Smithson and Norman Atkinson would follow this up and see if a similar project might be feasible in our parish. The Clerk to remind Duncan Fairbairn, County Councillor, that the Parish Council's request to the County Council's Gritting Review Panel for Heskett Newmarket's priority to be raised from 3 to 2 is due to be considered in June, and to ask for his support.

Following a meeting with Chairman and Clerk, Rob Terwey and Cheryl Cowperthwaite from Cumbria CC are going to find out if a sixteen-seater minibus-type service might be a possibility for a weekly shopping trip to Carlisle from Caldbeck, Heskett and Welton.

## A 'Caldbeck Parish Benches' fund, to maintain and replace benches.

Caldbeck Parish Council is responsible for seventeen benches, situated in strategic spots around the parish. Many have been given over the years by residents or by relatives of deceased residents, and others have been purchased by the Parish Council. To date, maintenance has been done voluntarily by Parish Councillors, sanding the majority of the benches and re-varnishing them each year.

Two problems are becoming apparent: a number of the benches are reaching the end of their natural lives, and the work needed to maintain them has increased with the number of benches! In fact a bench near the pond has had to be dismantled recently as it was becoming dangerous to sit on, and the one in the centre of Caldbeck village has got to be replaced in the next month or two for the same reason.

The Parish Council is applying for grants to try and replace these two benches, which were much appreciated by residents and visitors alike. But the Council is also looking to the long term and has decided to start a fund for the maintenance and replacement of benches. This fund will have a dedicated line in the budget so that it is clear how much has been given toward benches and how much has been spent on benches.

If anyone wished to donate the full cost of a bench (approximately £500 for a strong teak outdoor bench) that donation would be held until a current bench needs replacing. A plaque commemorating the donor costs approximately £50.

#### NORTHERN FELLS BROADBAND

The seven parishes of the northern fells have demonstrated a real enthusiasm to bring next generation broadband access to our communities. Between the 12<sup>th</sup> May and the 10<sup>th</sup> June 50% of households in the seven parishes registered an interest in getting better broadband. We expect it will be well over the halfway mark by the time you are reading this.

There are a number of ways that superfast broadband can be brought to the area. It is unlikely that just one method will work for all of the premises in the northern fells as we are a dispersed population with hills and dales and long tracks to negotiate. The committee have spoken to a number of suppliers who have expressed an interest in providing superfast broadband to the community.

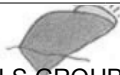

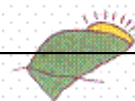

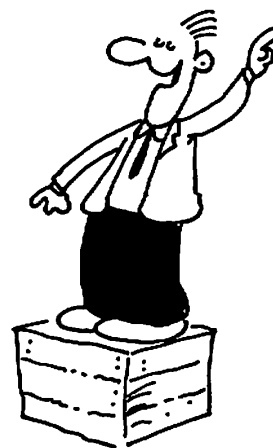

## PLEASE HELP PROTECT OUR NATIVE RED SQUIRRELS

The Red Squirrel is the UK's only native squirrel and Caldbeck parish red squirrels urgently need your help to prevent them from becoming extinct. They are under increasing threat from the grey squirrel, an introduction from America that out-competes them for food and carries the awful Squirrel Pox Virus (SQPV) that they themselves are immune to but which, when passed on to a red squirrel, causes the reds slow and painful death.

At the moment, the only way to save our reds is to keep the two species apart which we do by controlling the invading grey squirrels. There have been outbreaks of SQPV in this area therefore it is essential that sightings of both grey squirrels, and any sickly reds, are reported to your local volunteer coordinator (Rosemary Bailey) immediately.

Penrith & District Red Squirrel Group is a network of local volunteers working together to preserve our iconic, and genetically unique, Cumbrian red squirrel, but we need your support to help us;

- Buy traps & feed for grey squirrel control
- Buy feeders & feed for monitoring reds
- Fund blood sampling for research into SQPV
- Fund educational & promotional material
- Fund ongoing awareness campaigns
- Fund our squirrel rangers

We are volunteers so every penny that we raise goes directly towards red squirrel conservation. Why not send a donation or become a member, and encourage others to do so too, hold an event to raise money or give some time. 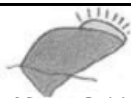

## FELLVIEW SCHOOL NEWS

In spite of the mixed weather we continue to participate in sporting competitions and outdoor activities.

Several of the Y5 and 6 children entered a triathlon, which comprised running, cycling and swimming. The postponed cricket match finally took place with our school coming 3<sup>rd</sup>. Years 1 and 2 came 2<sup>nd</sup> in an athletics competition. The after-school clubs this half-term are 'Enjoy a Ball' and football, with outside coaches coming into school to take the clubs.

The highlight of the outdoor experience for Year 5 and 6 was the residential visit to Barhaugh Hall at Alston. We joined forces with Welton for this. The children had to cross a 'Piranha' pool or suffer the consequences, take part in kayaking, cross zip wires and a host of other adventurous activities. They were kept fully occupied from morning to night and fell into bed exhausted from their activities.

R/Y1 and Y2 outdoor activity has been a visit to Armathwaite to the Forests Schools Project. They enjoyed making maps out of cones, twigs, etc., and exploring in the forest. Probably the highlight of their two days was lighting fires and the barbecue. The sausages were scrummy!

Y3 and 4 aren't being left out as they have an overnight trip planned to Borrowdale in July.

Reception to Year 4 children are all receiving swimming lessons at Richard Rose Academy in Carlisle this term.

Year 4, 5 and 6 pupils received Peer Mentoring training. This structured course is designed to enable children to deal with their own feelings and help understand and be sympathetic towards those of others. We received funding to support both this and the main part of the Forest Schools' project.

Staff from their chosen school visit Fellview to tell them about what they will experience and the children have induction days to meet staff and other pupils. This year our 7 leavers are going to 5 different schools, so the majority of them will be on their own at a new school. Quite daunting, but they seem to be taking it in their stride.

Nursery continues to flourish. The niggling problems left over from the building work are more or less sorted. The children enjoy varied activities and this term have visited the vets' practice. Liz Davis, our R/Y1/Y2 teacher, has been getting to know the children a bit better through reading regularly to them. It makes their transition into school much easier.

## Sebergham Weather Recordings

May 2011

### **Rainfall.**

**May 2011.** 123.40 mm (4.86 ins)

Aggregate 494.51 mm (19.67 ins)

**May 2010.** 22.10 mm (0.87 ins)

Aggregate 197.97 mm (7.81 ins)

### **Notes.**

*The first five months of this year the rainfall has nearly matched 2002 when we recorded a total of 562.70 (22.14 ins) to end of May. If you compare last year's rainfall to end of May you will see we are 150% up on this time last year! 2002 went on to be one of our wettest years here at Sebergham. The rest of the country will be envious and it is a pity it can't be shared out more evenly.*

### **Temperatures.**

Average maximum day temperature 15.12°C (59.21°F)

Average minimum night temperature 7.28°C (45.10°F)

Warmest day Friday 6 May 19.40°C (66.92°F)

Coollest night Tuesday 3 May -0.60°C (30.92°F)

### **Notes.**

*We recorded frost on only one night, Tuesday 3 May, which was similar to April with only one night of frost. The average monthly day temperature was a degree Celsius below that of April, but the night-time temperature was nearly two degrees Celsius warmer than April. However, this year's average monthly temperature for May has been about average for the month taken over a ten year period.*

### **Wind.**

The average wind speed for May was 3.1 mph, and on Monday 23 May we recorded a high of 37 mph at 18.00 hrs from the SSW. This is the day Scotland & the NE of England suffered from storm-force winds. The dominant wind direction for the month was from West North West.
