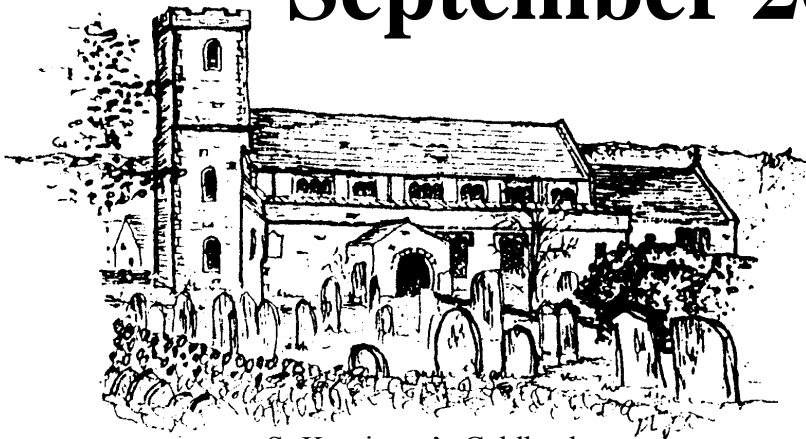

The Rector Writes

We are in the time of many agricultural shows at the moment: Hesket Newmarket, Skelton and others around the area. In September and October, our churches and chapels will be celebrating the autumn harvest with services of thanksgiving, suppers and sales. The late summer and early autumn calendar of agricultural shows, harvest services and harvest sales has a comforting regularity that itself reminds us of the order within God's creation, allowing for the provision of our 'daily bread' and so much more besides.

Both the blessing of God's creation and the work and ingenuity of men and women must be present in order for there to be a harvest to celebrate. We tend to see the land, the climate and the other natural elements of the farming process as a 'given' which has always been there and ever will be, although our farmers, more than the rest of us, have always been aware of their dependence on changes in the weather.

The prospect of climate change and the development of genetically modified crops reminds us that neither the environment in which we produce food or the things we grow remain unchanged. Both can be influenced - for good or ill - by mankind's activities. So at this harvest season, we not only thank God for the goodness of creation that allows us to have a harvest, we also pray that we may be good stewards of all that God has entrusted to us. It is not simply the farmers and gardeners involved, but all of us: how we shop, what we buy and what we eat today will affect the harvests of the future.

On our recent holiday in Tuscany (in a climate very different to that of the UK!) I was delighted to see so much fruit and vegetables being grown in the bottom lands, giving way to vineyards and olive orchards on the slopes. What is more, all the local produce was available in local shops and markets and purchased by the local people for everyday consumption. You got the idea that all the locals, farmers or not, were very proud of their local produce, which made up their normal diet. People knew and cared about where their food was produced. I can learn from such an example!

May God give us the ability to live in a way which makes all our lives a thanksgiving for His good gifts, and help us to be responsible stewards of the earth in our own country, county, and village - our garden!, throughout the year.

NOTES FROM CALDBECK PARISH COUNCIL

Allotments

The Allotments for Caldbeck Parish residents are sited in Hesket Newmarket behind the Chapel and Chapel House. They are all occupied at present but there is only a short waiting list so if any resident living anywhere in the parish (or within one half mile of the parish boundary) is interested in joining the waiting list please contact the Clerk.

Plastics recycling

The Parish Council has been trying to find a site for a Plastics Recycling cage but has had no success to date. The site would have to be the size of a car parking space as the cage is 2 metres high by 6 metres long by 4 metres wide. There also needs to be access for a lorry to drop the new cage beside the old, hook up and remove the old cage, and put the new cage in position. It was thought that Tenters car park is often full so not enough room there. Other ideas were behind the Map Shop on the School Green (problems envisaged with access for the pickup lorry) or the parking area opposite the Bowling Club (problems envisaged with unsightliness). If anyone can think of a possible site in Hesket Newmarket or Caldbeck for the Council to consider please contact the Clerk.

CALDBECK & DISTRICT LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

The History of Dalemain

At its July meeting in Caldbeck Parish Hall, Judith Doig spoke to the Caldbeck & District Local History Society on 'The History of Dalemain'. Mrs Doig, who was strikingly attired in a copy of a Georgian dress which she had seen in a portrait at Dalemain, has been a house guide there for some seven years.

The house, whose name means *house in the valley* is situated a few miles southwest of Penrith. From the outside it looks for all the world like a Georgian country house. However, behind its façade lies a Norman pele tower, an enclosed Tudor mansion and an inner courtyard. In addition, the medieval Old Hall now houses the tearoom.

In 1679, Sir Edward Hasell, a steward to Lady Anne Clifford, bought the Tudor mansion for £2710, and to the present day Dalemain continues to be the home of the Hasell family.

Much restoration and renovation followed his purchase and, together with his mother, he planned and built the Georgian part of Dalemain, which was completed in 1744. This was the last significant addition to the house.

Mrs Doig explained that a great deal is known about the history of the Hasell family since they still live there and the house contains numerous family portraits and much archival material. She was therefore able to recount many interesting (and often amusing) anecdotes about some of the more colourful characters and events in Dalemain's history.

In addition to the evolution of the house through the centuries, today's beautiful gardens also have a history of their own. Particular mention was made of the now famous show in early summer of the beautiful but difficult to grow Himalayan Blue Poppies.
